Access to News - Challenges

- Space / resources are increasingly scarce
- Variety, amount of news resources in electronic format increasing
- Born-digital archiving still not to scale
- New demands for scholarly access, use of content
- Uneven coverage / quality of digital resources



CRL's "News Agenda"

Advocacy

- Exert collective influence on publishers
- Support non-proprietary, community efforts
- Enlist support from non-traditional sectors

Assessment

- Better understand researcher needs
- Increase info on content & functionality
- Continue to monitor landscape of production



Licensing Overview

Objectives

- Exert collective influence on savings, terms, content & functionality,
- Support community efforts to influence the direction of the scholarly research enterprise.

- 24 news databases offered via license since 2010
- 174 takeups by 89 unique institutions

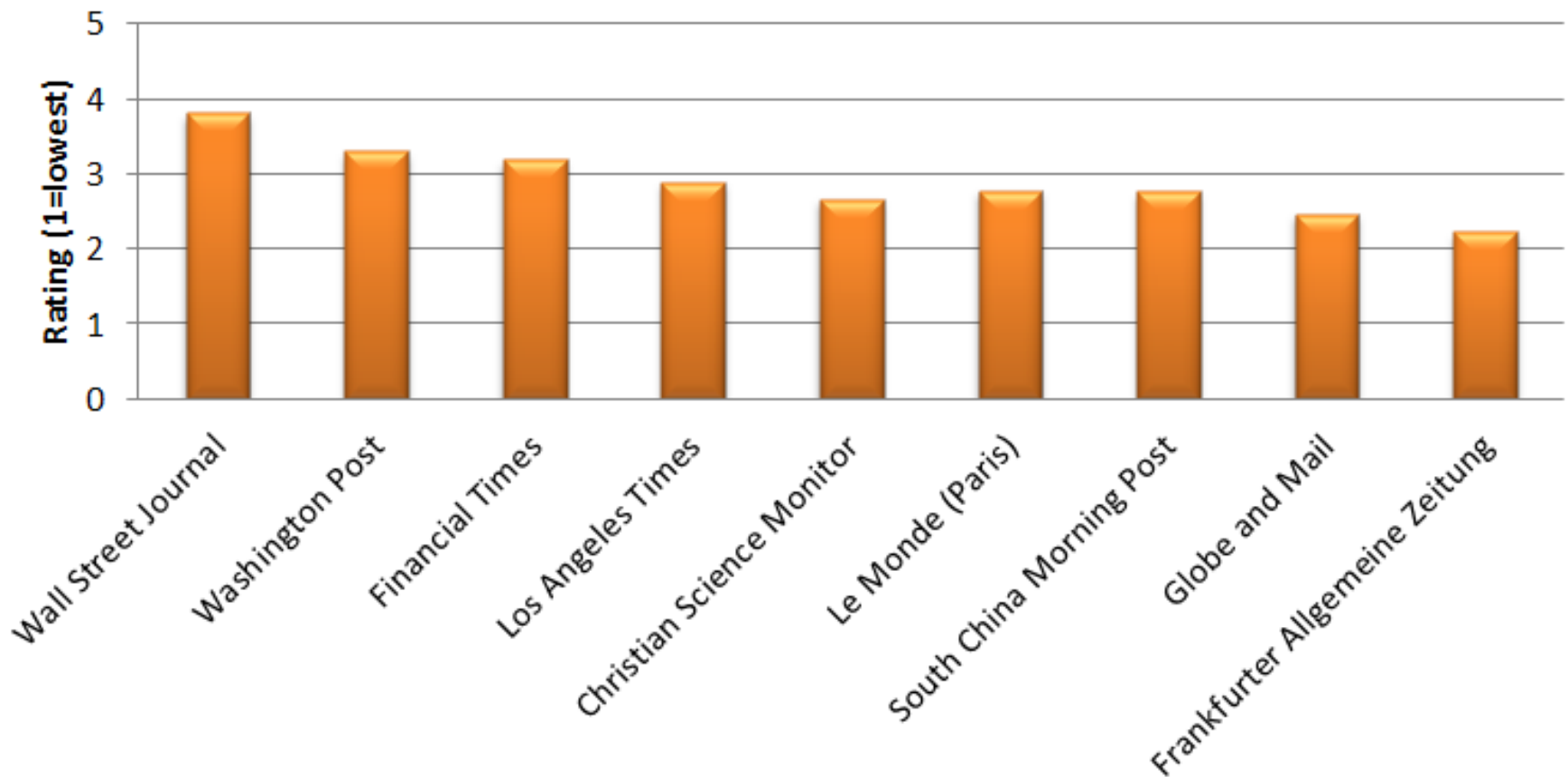

 - 1981–Present: Full articles accessible to subscribers.

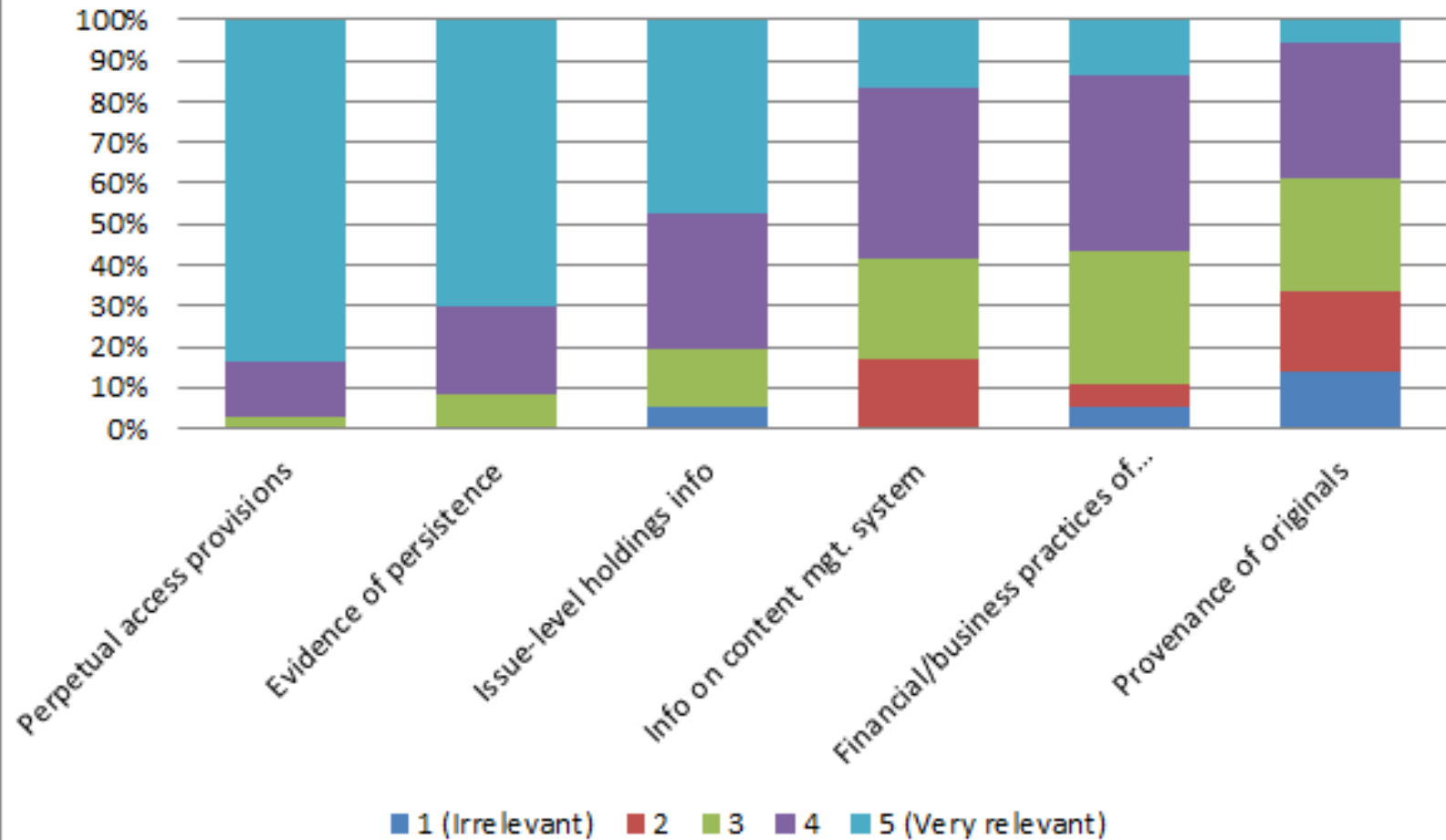


News publisher platforms - member interest

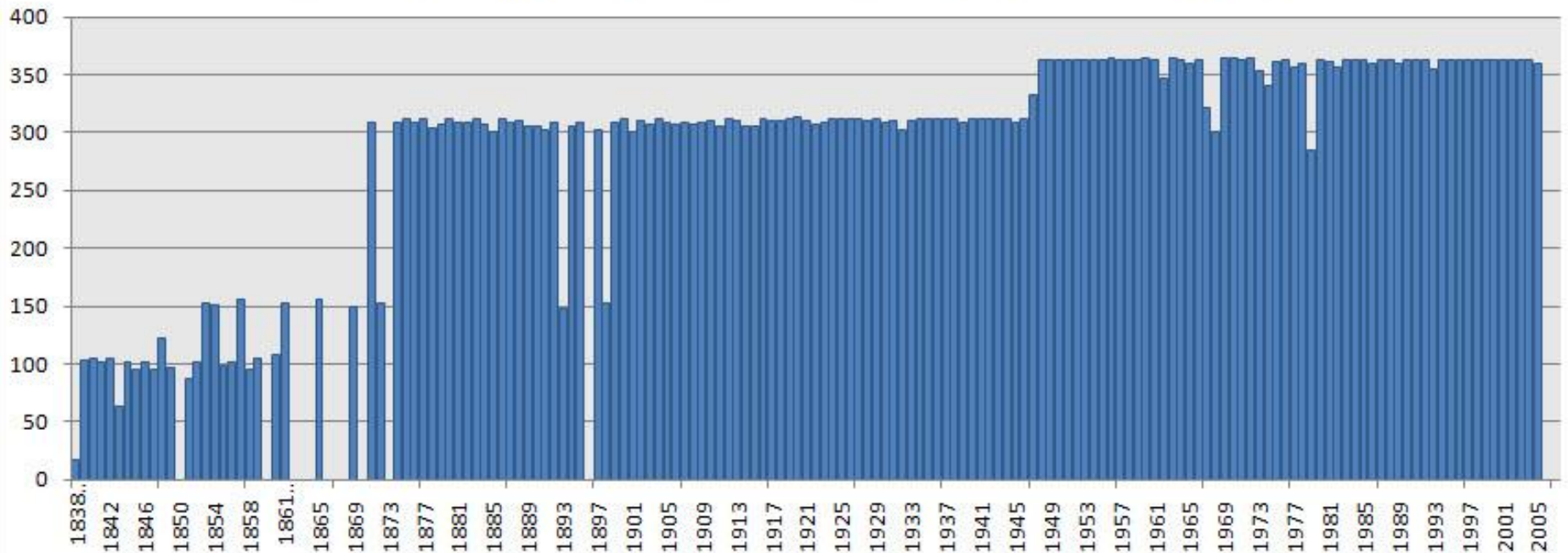

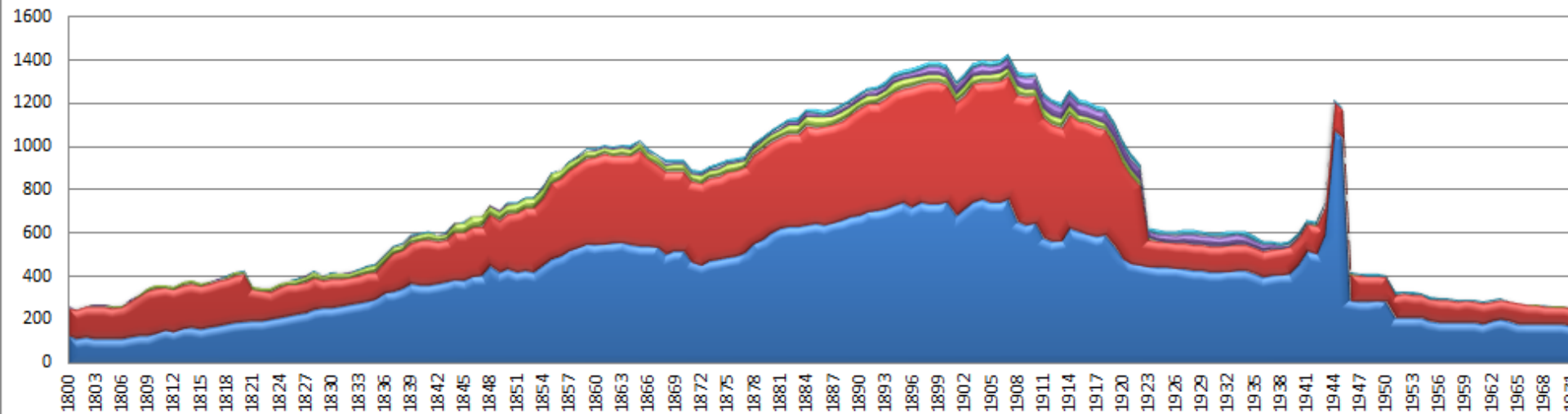

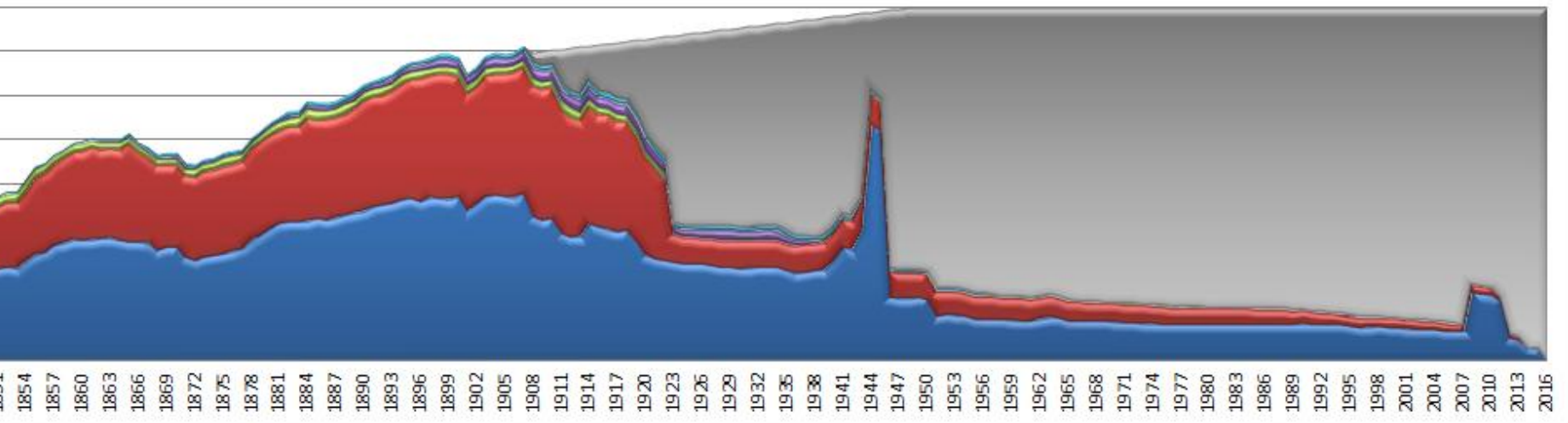

A windy, chilly inauguration day—but no rain or snow—was predicted today by the Weather Bureau, as the tempo of the week-long patriotic celebration quickened with arrival of thousands of visitors by special and regular transportation facilities. Issuing a special forecast, the forecaster said President Truman and Vice President-elect Barkley will be sworn in under cloudy skies. The high temperature during the day will be about 43 degrees and the morning low about 28, he added. There will be occasional rain tonight and tomorrow, with relatively mild temperatures, but the precipitation will end tomorrow night and

NANKING, Jan. 18.—Nationalist North China was falling apart today, and foreign diplomats expected momentarily to be notified that the Nanking government was being dispersed for safety reasons.

An order to this effect, an authoritative Foreign Office source said, is being prepared. But, he added, that does not mean Nanking is being abandoned as the capital. It will remain as such as long as Generalissimo Chiang Kai-shek stays here. Neither, he said, will the Chinese

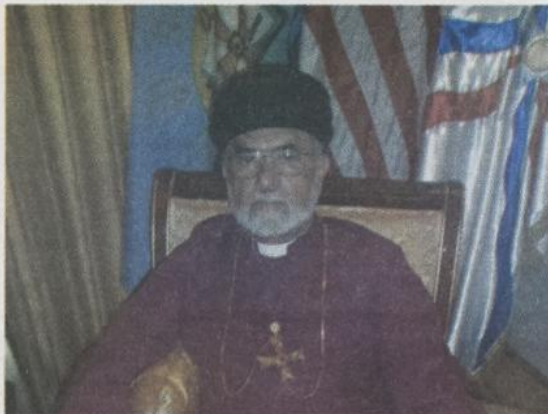

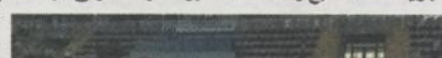
