The Technical Report Archive & Image Library (TRAIL) identifies, acquires, catalogs, digitizes, and provides unrestricted access to U.S. government agency technical reports. TRAIL currently consists of nearly 50 member institutions whose annual membership fees and volunteered staff time further the efforts of the project.

ENDURING VALUE

Millions of pages of elusive technical reports are now discoverable, thanks to the collaborative effort of TRAIL members.

As of 2018, TRAIL has made over 61,500 federal technical reports discoverable and searchable.
